200 foot waterfall - Gurley Falls

SEE 200 waterfall

- easy 2 minutes
- exit lodge to left
- walk to end of road
- make left at deer sign
- walk 2 minutes to observation deck

GET IN 200 ft waterfall

* recommended & most popular

- steep, but most people do it, 15 minutes
- exit lodge to the left
- go around side of lodge (turn at "cabins" sign)
- walk straight past the last cabin
- you will be on the left side of the stream
- trail will be in front of you and parallel the stream
- hike up 15 minutes
- get next to or in the waterfall

GO TO TOP 200 ft waterfall

- moderate 20 minutes
- exit lodge to the left
- go around side of lodge (turn at "cabins" sign)
- walk straight past the last cabin
- look to the left for a trail behind the green water tank |- you may continue for 1.5 miles to connect with the
- this trail take you to the top of the waterfall gradually Appalachian Trail
- once at the top you can cross the stream for more hiking

400 foot waterfall - Joel Falls

SEE 400 ft waterfall

- not too hard, 5 minutes
- exit lodge to right
- go around side of lodge
- walk straight toward small waterfall & pond
- stay on right side of stream
- hike 5 minutes
- you will come to stopping point and you can see part of the waterfall
- although guests have made a trail past this point, do not go further

TOP 400 waterfall

- not too hard 10 minutes
- exit lodge to right
- round the corner of the main road toward the entrance
- in a few feet, you'll see steps on the right
- take steps, then follow the trail (ridge) for 10 minutes
- listen for water to your right
- guests have made a trail down to the top of the waterfall
- you may continue for 1.5 miles to connect with the Appalachian Trail
